Fire	1x/month	118.07(2)(a)1. 118.07(2)(a)2.	Safety incident	If community has a recognized fire dept., to the dept. annually (on form SBD-11 from Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS))	May forego in case of inclement weather
Tornado (evacuation)	2x/annually	118.07(2)(a)1. 118.07(2)(a)2.	Safety incident	If community has a recognized fire dept., to the dept. annually (on a form provided by the DSPS)

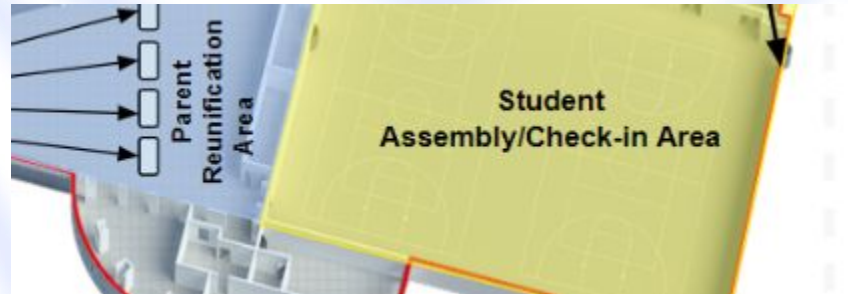

PROTECTING STUDENTS FROM ONLINE SEXTORTION

LIVE VIRTUAL EVENT FOR SCHOOL SAFETY PARTNERS

October 1, 2026
10:00 -11:00 a.m.

The Office of School Safety (OSS) is pleased to join the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force in an encore virtual learning opportunity for school safety partners.

Appropriate for all school safety stakeholders, this training event will address growing concerns around online exploitation of children with an added focus on sextortion, an increasingly common online threat frequently targeting school athletes. In an effort to get this important information in the hands of Wisconsin coaches and school athletics staff, **we are asking partners to share this flyer with school community members who work with student athletes.**

The event will include:

- An update on ICAC's efforts to address these ever-growing online concerns.
- Actionable recommendations to prevent online harm.
- Guidance on how to respond effectively to youth facing online threats, sextortion, and grooming.
- Information about Speak Up Speak Out (SUSO) and how OSS is partnering with ICAC to keep kids safe in schools and at home.
- Resources to support schools in their safety efforts.

Jesse Crowe has conducted hundreds of investigations into the online sexual exploitation of children and presents nationally and internationally on the topic of online exploitation.

In law enforcement since 1993, Jesse has held positions of patrol officer, SRO, Detective, and Detective Sergeant. In 2010 Jesse joined WI Department of Justice Division of Criminal Investigation as a Special Agent assigned to the ICAC task force. Jesse now holds the position of Special Agent in Charge and is the ICAC Commander for the Wisconsin ICAC Task Force and the Commander for the DCI Child Abduction Response Team. He supervises ICAC Investigations in Madison, Wausau and Eau Claire.

SPECTATOR EXPECTATIONS AND SPORTSMANSHIP GUIDELINES

Good sportsmanship is viewed by the WIAA in conjunction with the National Federation as a commitment to fair play, ethical behavior, and integrity. In perception and practice, sportsmanship is defined as those qualities which are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. The ideals of sportsmanship apply equally to all activity disciplines. Individuals, regardless of their role in activities, are expected to be aware of their influence on the behavior of others and model good sportsmanship.

FUNDAMENTALS OF SPORTSMANSHIP

1. Show respect for self and others at all times.
2. Show respect for the officials. Good sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
3. Know, understand, and appreciate the rules of the contest. Good sportsmanship suggests the importance of conforming to the spirit as well as the letter of the rules.
4. Maintain self-control at all times. Prevent the desire to win from overcoming rational behavior.
5. Recognize and appreciate skill in performance regardless of team affiliation.
